## Navigating Our Future: Embracing the Waka Hourua Metaphor in Aquinas College's Strategic Plan – He Waka Eke Noa


At Aquinas College, we have charted our Strategic Plan using the waka hourua metaphor, symbolising a purposeful journey towards our vision. The waka hourua, a double-hulled canoe used by Māori ancestors for ocean voyages, serves as a powerful symbol. The first hull represents our unwavering Catholic faith, steered by the teachings of Christ. The second hull signifies our deep commitment to Mātauranga Māori, upholding the tenets of Te Tiriti o Waitangi. This metaphor, embodying unity and balance, is pivotal in navigating our educational path. It affirms our dedication to a balanced and respectful educational approach that values both the spiritual guidance of our Catholic ethos and the rich cultural heritage of Mātauranga Māori.

The Kiato (crossbeams), representing our strategic objectives, play a pivotal role in the Waka Hourua. These kiato are not merely structural; they embody the harmonious blend of our Catholic Character and our commitment to Mātauranga Māori, symbolising the interconnectedness and balance of our guiding forces. This ensures that our voyage towards 'Educating Catholic leaders through faith and action' is steady and aligned.




#### **Ngā tohu o te rā | Daytime guides** – Data and Analysis
